Students Examine Humanities Through New Course

Manoogian students are being introduced to the world of art, thanks to a new, one-semester course – *Introduction to the Humanities*.

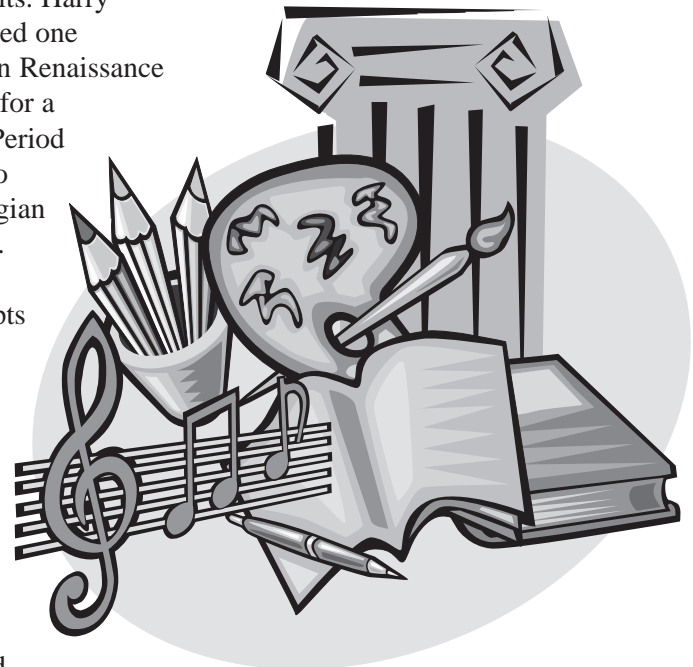
According to administrators, the course examines the development of art, architecture, literature, and music throughout history, with emphasis on how these topics are related to the social, political, and scientific activities of the time.

The students involved in the course, all seniors, have been afforded the luxury of having specialists within the Manoogian Community speak to them on various disciplines.

Architects Osep Sarafian and Harry Vaporciyan have already spoken to the students twice and are

scheduled for return visits. Harry Hovakimian has delivered one demonstration lecture on Renaissance music and is scheduled for a discussion of Baroque Period music. The students also have visited the Manoogian Museum, adjacent to St. John's Church, to hear about ancient manuscripts from Rev. Father Garabed Kochakian.

The course will end with a final presentation from each student, as they will give a presentation on the development of humanities in a specific location and time period.

Students Honor History With Celebration

The Spirit of Vartan was celebrated recently at Manoogian School as the elementary and middle schools participated with songs and plays honoring Vartan.

As usual, the celebration included colorful costumes and motivated performances.

According to Armenian historians, in 451 King Hazgerd II of Persia made a simple order to the Armenians: convert their religious beliefs, build temples, and conduct fire worship.

Under the leadership of Vartan Mamigonian, the Armenians refused and an army of 66,000 attacked the Persians at the river of Dghmoud on May 26. Outnumbered more than 4-to-1, the Armenians managed early victories, but wound up losing Vartan and retreating.

Though they lost the battle to the Persians, the Armenians accomplished two things: they held to their Christian faith and won a moral victory by fighting Hazgerd's army.

What's Happening...

The Manoogian School art room is overflowing with colors, textures, and forms. When one enters the room, it is easy to see a vast range of projects in various stages. Among those projects is a still life for high school students to study the effects of light on form. The elementary art classes learn about such artists as Claude Monet, Henri Matisse, Vincent Van Gogh, Henri Rousseau, Georges Seurat, and Georgia O'Keeffe.

In January, Razmig Sagherian was declared school champion of the school's first National Geographic Society Competition. Though the competition was heated, eighth-grader Sagherian persevered and took home the title.

Can a school orchestra be far behind? This school year a group of talented instrumentalists have joined the school's base of talented pianists and violinists. Carie Kalinowski and Steven Keranen, both of the Wayne State University music department, have generated a lot of enthusiasm by introducing students to woodwind and brass instruments.
