A National Tragedy:

How Manoogian Coped

Manoogian was just one of many educational institutions having to deal with the terrorist attacks in New York and Washington, D.C. Students needed to cope with something they had never experienced in their lifetimes.

Most important was to stress normalcy, according to vice principal Hosesep Torossian.

Torossian said that on September 11, the day of the attack, the administration brought the Upper School students together and viewed the events on television, conducting discussions as well.

Torossian said the next day the school informed parents on how to handle their children regarding the tragedy. Parents were also advised that counselors and teachers were available for grief counseling.

The week in the aftermath of the terrorist attack continued with assemblies for elementary, middle, and high school students, specifically addressing what had occurred during the previous 48 hours.

The week ended September 14 with a show of solidarity in the form of Red, White, and Blue Day. The school also observed a moment of silence on what President Bush called, "A National Day of Prayer and Remembrance." Family Fun Night, to be held that evening, was postponed until October 12.

The entire school held a cash fund-raiser, with the proceeds going to the American Red Cross. Students have raised more than \$1,000.



New Teachers Welcomed
